

Alzheimer Family Caregiver Support Program (AFCSP)



The Alzheimer Family Caregiver Support Program (AFCSP) helps families, like yours, care for someone with dementia. The goal is to help persons with dementia live in the community as long as possible.

What is AFCSP?

The purpose of AFCSP is to help you, as a caregiver, have access to community services. If you qualify, the program provides funding to purchase goods and services that will support caring for your loved one in their home as long as possible. Funding is limited. Applications through ADRC are required (see *below*).

Do I qualify for AFCSP?

As a caregiver, you are eligible if you and your loved one with dementia meet the following criteria:

1. Physician-verified Alzheimer's disease or related dementia.
2. Currently residing at home.
3. Not receiving services through Medicaid Long Term Care Funding IRIS, Family Care or Partnership

What Community Supports can AFCSP Cover?

Typical goods and services include, but are not limited to:

- Respite - time alone for errands or rest
- Transportation
- Home safety modifications
- Incontinence supplies
- Adaptive medical equipment
- Emergency response systems
- Meal prep, home care services, medication assistance, yard work
