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Definition of Programs/Services (pages 1-3)

Day Program: A professional care setting in which older adults, adults living with dementia, or adults living with disabilities receive individualized therapeutic, social, and health services for some part of the day.

Vocational Program: Services offered to individuals with mental or physical disabilities to assist individuals in job preparation and training. Services offered may also help an individual retrain for employment after an injury or mental disorder has disrupted previous employment.

In-Home Care: Supportive care provided in the home. Care may be provided by licensed healthcare professionals who provide medical treatment needs or by professional caregivers who provide daily assistance to ensure the activities of daily living are met.

Daily Living Skills Definition: A wide range of personal self-care activities across home, school, work, and community settings. Most daily living skills, like food preparation and personal hygiene, need to be performed regularly to maintain a reasonable level of health and safety.

Educational Program Definition: A coherent set or sequence of educational activities designed and organized to achieve pre-determined learning objectives or accomplish a specific set of educational tasks over a sustained period. May include educational activities, outings, or experiences to supplement learning.

Family Care and IRIS are Public Funded Long-Term Care options to help keep people with disabilities and older adults as independent as possible in the community by funding the supports they need. For more information on eligibility or questions about the program, please contact the ADRC.
